Are you a credentialed K–12 teacher or are you pursuing a teaching credential? If so, consider becoming a Teacher Librarian (also referred to as Library Media Specialist).

As a Teacher Librarian with the MLIS degree, you'll be a librarian, a teacher, and an instructional partner.

As a **librarian**, you'll manage the school library and build a collection of resources in a wide variety of print and electronic media. You'll also introduce young people to the world of literature and ideas.

As a **teacher**, you'll teach students to find their way around a library and a database; to conduct effective research; and to use the internet to its full advantage.

As an **instructional partner**, you'll work with faculty to help students learn how to find, evaluate, and use information, and build lasting information literacy skills.

You'll be a collaborative member of your school's learning community.

Teacher Librarian candidates must hold valid state teaching credentials, complete an approved course of study in an MLIS degree program, and apply to their state's Department of Education for the Teacher Librarian or Library Media Specialist credential.

Our MLIS program is fully accredited by the American Library Association, and our School has been awarding graduate degrees to information professionals for more than 50 years. Our Teacher Librarian specialization is ranked #4 in the nation by US News & World Report.

Our school's Teacher Librarian coursework is approved by the National Commission for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) and meets the requirements for the California Teacher Librarian Services Credential.
